Notice of Embargoed forest areas

Rowdy Flat (Yackandandah) and Kangaroo Crossing (Eldorado) - from now to 24 March 2014.

Apart from direct participation in the events on the weekend of 22-23 March 2014, any form of orienteering competition or training, including going for a solo or group training run/walk/bike ride with a map, or running/walking/riding off formed roads without a map, is prohibited in the following areas from 17 December 2013 until 24 March 2014.

The whole of the Rowdy Flat map and surrounding forest (within 2 km) - embargoed.

The whole of Kangaroo Crossing map (2012 version) – embargoed.

Anyone found transgressing these embargoes may be ineligible to compete on the weekend of 22-23 March 2014. This embargo applies also to any family member, coach or advisor of an orienteer planning to compete in the National Orienteering League events on the weekend of 22 – 23 March.

Be advised that the Yackandandah Folk Festival is on from Fri 21 to Sunday 23 March 2014. However, there are plenty of other places closer to Eldorado.

Wangaratta would also be suitable.

Emergency policy

In the event of a major emergency, such as a weather forecast of extreme fire danger, the organisers will take action to protect competitors. This will be based on an informed risk assessment and consultation with experts and authorities.

Possible actions include the cancellation of one or both events at short notice, possibly as late as the morning of a race. Based on temperature and wind patterns in the north east of Victoria in late March, this is assessed by the organisers as most unlikely.

The organisers will not compensate for money expended on travelling to and staying in north eastern Victoria for these events, should one or both events be cancelled.
